READY, S.E.T., APPLY

S.E.T. or **Science, Engineering and Technology**, is a new focus area of 4-H project work. The National and Connecticut 4-H programs are committed to promoting science, engineering and technology in 4-H projects with the goal of reaching 1 million new 4-H'ers nationally by 2013!

Many clubs, groups and 4-H members are already using technology in their projects to keep records, to communicate with each other, and as part of their current project focus. New focus areas for 4-H members are also being explored, such as rocketry, LEGO robotics, and more.

Each state has a designated adult S.E.T. liaison; in Connecticut it is Linda Horn. We are looking for a 4-H teen, age 14 or older, to be the **Connecticut teen S.E.T. liaison**. The teen liaison would receive group emails regarding S.E.T. from National 4-H, be part of the phone conferences and work with the adult liaison to consider opportunities and resources that would help to expand the concept of S.E.T. in Connecticut 4-H. Mandated Reported Trainings

All 4-H volunteer leaders must comply with the directive to have had mandated reporter training. Some volunteers may have had this training through other venues, such as the school in which you teach or your place of worship. If this is the case, you can provide the county 4-H office with documentation and not be required to repeat training. Currently no new trainings have been scheduled; however continue to check future newsletters, emails and the CT 4-H website for updated information. Anyone serving as a chaperone with 4-H groups must be a registered volunteer with Connecticut 4-H as well as complete this training.

4-H Dog Camp & Clinic

Registered 4-H dog project members are invited to attend New England 4-H Dog Camp and Clinic held at the Tolland Ag Center in Vernon, on April 19. Participants will take part in workshops in dog obedience, showmanship, agility, general care, learn more about careers and participate in dog knowledge activity. What is the 4-H Education Center at Auer Farm?

The 4-H Education Center at Auer Farm is a unique agricultural and learning resource in the Hartford metropolitan area. Located on Route 185 in Bloomfield, Connecticut, just moments from the center of Hartford, this 120-acre farm's is a beautiful setting for a wealth of opportunities for children and adults who come to learn about science and agriculture and to enjoy its open space and spectacular views.

Auer Farm was generously donated by the Auerbach Family to the CT 4-H Development Fund, Inc., which wisely continues to preserve it for children and the community. This active farm includes apple orchards, raspberries, blueberries, corn, hay and more than 15 buildings. It is the home to outstanding educational programs for more than 17,000 children each year using curricula coordinated with the Connecticut state science framework.

The farm animals, corn maze, hayrides, seasonal programs and wide variety of volunteer opportunities make this a fun and interesting destination.

Connecticut 4-H State Photography and Art Contest



Objectives:

To encourage 4-H members to use photography and art as a meaningful communication tool

To develop life skills in communication and expressive arts

To provide a photography and art showcase opportunity for 4-H members

Criteria:

This contest is open to all registered Connecticut 4-H members, ages 7-19. Membership in a 4-H photography project or expressive arts project is not required.

Age is determined as of January 1, 2008. This contest has two categories which are Photography and Artwork. See additional information below.

Any items submitted must have been taken or created by the 4-H member submitting the entry.

The following information must be attached to the back of each entry: Name of 4-H member; age; address, including town/city; State & zip; county affiliation & phone number.

There are two separate divisions that may be entered. Entrants must submit their items within the division that applies to them – Junior ages 7-12 OR Senior ages 13-19.

NO frames or mat boards on any artwork or photos. Photos may be inserted in a page protector if desired.

Artwork or photography may be of any subject.

An individual may submit a **total of up to two (2) items**.

Captions on artwork or photos are optional.

In Addition:

Photos:

Traditional prints, enlargements, digital photographs or photos printed by member are acceptable. Digital photos should be of a high resolution for best results in enlargements.

Color or black and white allowed.

Sizes accepted will be 4"x6", 5"x7" or 8"x10" only.

All photos, including digital, must be printed out on photo paper.

Art entries:

Artwork is considered to be items which could be framed, such as sketches, watercolors, drawings and paintings. For this contest, however, no frames or mats are allowed.

Deadline:

Artwork and Photos must be postmarked by midnight February 15, 2008 and returned to Nancy Wilhelm, State 4-H Office, 1376 Storrs Road, Storrs, CT 06269-4134.

Judging:

Judges will be selected from qualified individuals in the field of photography, graphic art or fine arts. Artwork and photography will be judged in separate categories. The decision of the judges is final and not subject to change.

Awards:

All photos and artwork will be judged and receive appropriate ribbons using the Danish system. A "Best of Show" Award rosette will be given in both senior and junior divisions in both photography and art work. Photos may be scanned and originals returned at a future date. The CT 4-H Program will use all items for promotional purposes throughout the year.

Objectives:

- To provide an opportunity for 4-H members to demonstrate their creativity through the performing arts.
- To develop poise and self-confidence before an audience.
- To provide a state level performing arts showcase for 4-H members.

Eligibility/Requirements:

- This event is open to all registered Connecticut 4-H members ages 7-19.
- Age is determined as of January 1, 2007.

Talent Show entries must be **postmarked by midnight March 1, 2008 and sent to Nancy Wilhelm, State 4-H Office, 1376 Storrs Road, Storrs, CT 06269-4134**. Entries must include registration form along with a standard vhs videotape, cd or dvd of the intended performance.

General Guidelines:

- Talent acts may be presented by an individual or group.
- Talent acts may be drawn from dance, dramatic, variety, instrumental and vocal arts.
- Each act should be a maximum of five (5) minutes.

Participants should consider the following items when selecting and presenting a talent act:

- a. stage presence and professionalism – overall confidence, poise, and ability to communicate with the audience.
- b. technical ability – voice quality, pitch, projection, use of instruments and props.
- c. appropriate dress or costume
- d. difficulty of selection of act
- e. creativity
- f. audience appeal

- Animal acts, use of fire, acts requiring excessive time to set up and special lighting are not allowed.
- The auditorium to be used for the talent show will have a microphone and a sound system for a cd. Participants should bring their own amplifiers and equipment to prevent any compatibility issues.
A piano is not available for use.

Evaluation:

There will be no judging of performances. The talent show is intended to give 4-H members an opportunity to showcase their creativity through the performing arts. The show will be evaluated to determine if future judging is appropriate for this event. All participants will receive participation ribbons.

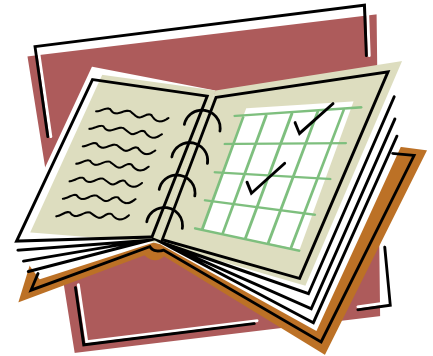
University of Connecticut 4-H Talent Show

All 4-Hers are invited to participate in this exciting competition! 4-Hers may present a demonstration, illustrated talk, or a speech. Juniors (ages 7 – 12 as of Jan. 1, 2008) should give presentations that are at least 2 minutes in length. Seniors (ages 13 – 18 as of January 1, 2008) will need to make their presentations at least 5 minutes but not more than 8 minutes in length. 4-Hers may choose any subject that is of interest to them. Think about your subject and begin to work on your presentation. It can be about your project, or a serious, humorous or educational topic. Brief note cards are okay. 4-Hers should refrain from reading their presentations from a written script. 4-Hers may choose to use a lectern or may give their presentation without a lectern. A demonstration table and an easel will be available for demonstrations, team demonstrations and illustrated talks if you wish to use them. 4-Hers wishing to use power point presentations for part of their illustrated talks must provide their own equipment. **Attention Seniors:** there is a new category at the state contest in visual presentations. Your visual presentation should be used to enhance your speech. Two seniors from each county will be selected to participate in the State Public Speaking Contest on April 12th at the University of Connecticut in West Hartford. One will be in the speech category and one will be in the visual presentation category. A visual presentation may be a demonstration, an illustrated talk or a power point presentation. Teams are not eligible for the State Contest and all of the individual presentations must be from 5-8 minutes in length. Ribbons will be presented to all contestants and a junior and senior winners will be selected from each county to receive a special award. Other awards may be presented at the discretion of the judges. Two senior winners will represent their County at the State Finals. All 4-Hers that make presentations at this regional event will be eligible to present their demonstrations, illustrated talks or speeches at Eastern States Exposition in the New England Center during Connecticut 4-H day. The evaluation sheets for demonstrations, illustrated talks, junior speeches and senior speeches are available by calling the Tolland County Extension Office at the above number. **Important:** You must register for the contest in order to participate. 4-Hers that are registered will be called by 8AM in case the event must be cancelled due to a **major** snow or ice storm. It will be rescheduled for Saturday, February 16. **Register for the contest by Wednesday February 6, 2008. The information needed is below.**

PUBLIC SPEAKING CATEGORIES

Speech

- It's best to use note cards only – involves telling about something of interest to you without the use of visual aids. The speech can be funny, serious, informative or argumentative.

Visual Presentations

- Demonstration – The demonstrator is doing something. Making, creating, or showing the audience how to do something while telling about it.
- Illustrated Talk – involves telling about something while using an illustration such as a diagram, chart, model, or picture
- Power Point - A demonstration or illustrated talk that uses computer technology. For Power Point presentations you must bring all of your own equipment. Only the screen will be provided.
- Team Demonstrations - A team is TWO people. Both participants must have an equal role in the presentation.

State 4-H Day – Textile Arts Exhibit 2008

All Exhibits will be evaluated and will receive ribbons during the awards part of the State 4-H Day program (April 12). Exhibits must be received at your local Extension Center prior to Fashion Revue or be delivered to the New Haven County Extension Center by March 25, 2008. Exhibits will be evaluated prior to the State 4-H Day Program and will be displayed during State 4-H Day. Exhibitors are responsible for picking up their exhibits at the end of the State 4-H Day Program (or making arrangements to have them picked up). Exhibits must have been made by the 4-H member between April 1, 2007 and March of 2008.

All items must be sewn, woven or stitched. "Non sewn" items, such as hand tied fleece blankets or items that are hot stitched or fused together will be not be accepted. 4-H members may exhibit up to two different items in each category. It is recommended but not mandatory that 4-H members enter their projects in their county Fashion Review programs.

Categories



- Quilt, Quilted wall hanging or quilted article
- Knitted article
- Crocheted article
- Needlework article: Crewel, Counted Cross Stitched or Needlepoint
- Sewn Accessory (purse, hat, tote bag, pillow etc.)
- Woven article
- Felting, sewn or as used in needlework
